In her role, Stewart will focus on leading Goodwill's mission services components and aligning those services with GIA's guiding mission to change lives through education, training and employment.

I am excited to help expand our services and reach even more individuals across the state."

Before joining Goodwill Industries of Arkansas, Stewart served as the Director of Educator Preparation for Arkansas' Division of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE). In that role she led the teacher recruitment and retention team, oversaw both traditional and alternative routes to licensure efforts, and served as a liaison between the DESE and Arkansas' educator preparation programs. Additionally, Stewart served on the board of directors for The Excel Center for the last three years.

Stewart began her career in education more than 30 years ago as an elementary and special education teacher in classrooms in Arkansas, Connecticut, Tennessee, and Ohio. She eventually

joined the University of Cincinnati's educator preparation program and led the teacher preparation program and taught a variety of upper-level undergraduate education courses.

Stewart moved back to her home state of Arkansas in 2018 and served as assistant vice chancellor for enrollment management at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock. She led eight departments and co-authored the campus' Recruitment and Retention Strategic Plan.

Stewart serves on the Arkansas Geographical Minority Scholarship Committee and volunteers with the Arkansas Single Parent Scholarship Fund and Our House.
